UPCOMING GENERAL CONFERENCE NOMINATION PROCESS

Our Upper Midwest Global Methodist Provisional Conference is now moving into a time of discernment as we prepare for our Annual Conference in June and our denomination's Convening General Conference in September.

At the Annual Conference, we will be electing 12 clergy and 12 laity for our delegation to the Convening Conference. This will give us 6 or 7 delegates, plus 2 alternates, and 3 or 4 reserves. (Our final number of delegates will be given to us in June.) The alternates should plan to attend the General Conference. The reserves will not travel unless someone is not able to serve as a delegate. You can find the directory of those who self-nominated here.

Our Conference Leadership Council is going to offer a recommended slate of delegates to the Annual Conference. All nominees will be interviewed by a team from the Leadership Council. This team will be made up of Leadership Council members who are not going to General Conference. The goal will be to have a slate that represents our whole conference well. This process has been used in other conferences of the Global Methodist Church, especially in conferences like ours that cover a large geographic space and combine several annual conferences from our previous denomination. We may not know everyone in our conference well enough to discern a representative delegation just yet. (We are only 6 months old.)

This process may only be used this time for elections because of our infancy as an organization. This process will also only be used if approved by the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference will have the opportunity to decline using the slate, and we would then enter a process of discernment by individuals. So, the Annual Conference will have to vote to approve our delegation.

I know this could be confusing, so ask questions. Talk with your presiding elder.

Thank you to all who are willing to represent us at the Convening General Conference, where our denomination will move out of our transitional phase. Through much prayer and collaboration, our foundation of doctrine and discipline will be approved. May we all be covering this process in prayer.

I WANT A PUP FROM THAT LITTER: THE APPOINTMENT PROCESS

North Dakota Cowboy Wisdom

When I was young, I remember a couple of old cowboys talking about an outstanding high school football player. This guy was athletic, smart, and a real hard worker. As these old guys discussed and came to their conclusion that this was indeed a fine young man, one of them said, "I want a pup from that litter." The cowboy's words tickled my fancy, I never forgot them. I just needed the perfect time to use the phrase, and now I found it.

The Upper Midwest Provisional Conference is about six months old, and we are old enough to have our first rounds of new pastoral appointments. So, what can we expect from the Conference when it comes to receiving a new pastor? How do we pick a pup from this litter? Well, we don't pick alone, the church that is looking to fill a pastoral appointment fills out a church profile with the help of the presiding elder of their part of the conference. Then with prayer and the rest of the cabinet the conference looks at who is available and who has the gifts to match the church. The church examines the pastor or pastors advanced by the Conference. When the right match is found, the match is sent to Bishop Webb for his approval and the fixing of the appointment.

What are the attributes that the Conference considers for someone to fill the role of pastor in the Global Methodist Church?

- First, the Conference will guarantee that the pastor agrees with our Articles of Religion of the Methodist Church and the Confession of Faith of the Evangelical United Brethren Church. Our core beliefs about God, Scripture, and our engagement with the world are non-negotiable.
- Second, we will provide opportunities for education and guidance of pastors ensuring they have the skills
 to faithfully pastor God's people. Every pastor is part of a ministry team and mentored by a presiding
 elder. Though our pastors may start with different degrees of education, all must perform the office of
 pastor in a Christlike manner.
 - Certified Lay Minsters are laypersons who work on a team headed by an ordained elder. They completed the Conference Lay Ministry School.

- Supply Pastors are people with a call to ministry whose call may have come at a time in their lives when full time seminary education would be difficult. The Supply Pastor is a candidate for ordained ministry committed to a course of study moving them toward ordination.
- o Ordained pastors have completed their formal education and have proved the mastery of ministry as guided by the Conference Board of Ministry.
- Finally, the Conference will bring the best person the Conference has for the church. The Conference promises not to allow anything to influence the bringing of the right pastor to the church. Gender and ethnic origin will not be considered, only the needs of the church and the gifts of the pastor to meet those needs. I guess I am saying, we will bring you the pick of the litter.

Through prayer and collaboration, churches will be blessed and so will the kingdom of God. I pray that the matches are so good that everyone who experiences the blessing of their pastor will say, "I want a pup from that litter."

Her doctoral degree focused on church planting with an emphasis on how women lead spiritually.

In addition to serving as a pastor, Carolyn hosts a podcast and blogs on issues related to holiness, supernatural ministry, and Wesleyan theology at ArtOfHoliness.com. She is the author of four Bible studies (Encounter Jesus, Encounter the Spirit, Encounter the Father and Supernatural, published by Seedbed) and two books (The 19, published by Abingdon; and When Women Lead, published by Zondervan). She has served on various boards and commissions promoting missions, outreach, and the Global Methodist Church.

Carolyn has been joyfully married since 1985 to Steve Moore, a retired public-school teacher and avid student of U.S. History. They have one daughter who is married with two children.


