General Conference Delegates

Happy New Year! We begin 2025 with many blessings: we are finding our feet as a Conference, we have a Book of Discipline, and are boldly living the call to be the presence of Jesus Christ in our local communities. This list is not exhaustive. Please add your own blessings, both personal and collective to this list.

One blessing for 2025 is the selecting of delegates to the 2026 General Conference of the Church. Seems we just completed the task for the Convening Conference in 2024 and here we are starting the process for the first General Conference of the church. The Leadership of our Conference believes we have grown in our knowledge of each other and would like to change the process of selecting delegates.

For the Convening Conference 2024, a slate of delegates, both laity and clergy were proposed. This slate encompassed regional representatives from all the States making up the Upper Midwest Conference. We as an Annual Conference affirmed the slate presented to us.

Rather than a slate of delegates presented by the Leadership Team, we are asking for nominations of people willing to serve as delegates. The nominations can originate with a person nominating themself or a person nominated by their local church or another individual. With the endorsement of their local church, nominees are added to the ballot and will be voted on at our upcoming Annual Conference.

The first General Conference of the Global Methodist Church will take place in 2026 in Africa. The place in Africa and

the dates are yet to be determined. But a delegate must be willing to travel internationally. Besides the actual Conference, delegates are expected to serve on committees and spend a considerable amount of time studying the proposals and legislation brought to the Conference.

Prayerfully consider God's call on your life as a possible delegate.

Our timeline is:

- January and February: A time of prayerful discernment of nominations.
- March: The actual nomination made, and the Leadership Council contacted.
- April and May: Completing a biographical sketch that will be shared with the Annual Conference.
- June: The election of delegates at Annual Conference.

The number of delegates, alternates and reserves are yet to be determined.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration of this important ministry.



At our Annual Conference 2024 the phrase "deliverance from dead discipleship practices" was used in the Multiplication Team report when discussing the path forward toward multiplication.

Hopefully, you are reading that line and asking yourself,

"What does that even mean?"

Here are two quick examples:

Method over Message

When a congregation's worship services and ministry practices are more about checking boxes with no regard to effectiveness of genuine spiritual engagement then we have come to value our method more than the life transforming, soul saving message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. If personal preference always wins in discussions concerning needed change for ministry effectiveness then our directive to die to self in order to follow Jesus has been neglected.

Mission Disconnect

Organizations will often talk about mission drift. Mission drift is when an organization begins to lose sight of our core values and drifts off course from the intended trajectory. Mission drift can typically be corrected because at least they are still moving forward in the general direction of their goal/destination.

Mission Disconnect unfortunately is when an organization still holds their core values to be true but rather than distracted or drifting they are instead sitting dead in the water. Because they have disconnected from the Great Commission they are no longer propelled by mission. No vibrancy, no urgency, and no movement. What does this look like? It looks like a congregation with all the meetings and committee people doing all the "right things" but the focus is inward, the congregation is faith-stagnant, and if the church closed tomorrow there might be one less food pantry in the community but the number of souls being saved or lost remains unchanged. And this isn't a small church problem, it is a church problem. I sat in on a round table discussion where the on-staff statistician of a 20,000 church in LA stated, "We are great at getting our people to give but most can't tell you their own testimony."

"So what do we do about this?"

- 1st: Gather one or two other spiritual leaders and seriously assess your congregation from a place of discernment.

 Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal areas of drift, disconnect, or where preferences might be stifling needed change. And if you are bold enough to ask in prayer then be sure to give space to listen and then have the conviction to respond.
- **2nd:** Start small, start now, stay consistent. Commit to continued prayer and discernment and use resources like Thom Rainer's books Autopsy of a Deceased Church and Anatomy of a Revived Church to assist discussion.
- **3rd:** Realize this isn't something for only the pastor(s). It takes your pastor(s) being a part of a spiritual leadership community which is actively engaging the whole of the congregation in participating in the Great Commission.

As your Multiplication Team and the Conference it is our desire to see Every Church Plant but to see this happen "it is our hope to see healthy congregations of all sizes participating in church planting by the year 2030." The health and missional drive of your local congregation is key to us being a conference where it is our churches who are multiplying and planting churches.

- 7. Average Attendance of Youth in Discipleship Ministries (Ages 12-18).
- 8. Average Attendance of Kids in Discipleship Ministries (Ages 0-11).
- 9. Number of People Serving in Missions (Mission trips, Compassion and Evangelism Ministries with a purpose of serving people not connected to the local church etc.).
- 10. Total Operating Income.

This morning, I was watching the news about the fires raging in southern California and the devastation it has wrought. So many people whose lives have been disrupted into chaos. Last week I was on a Zoom call with all the Disaster Relief Coordinators from the Global Methodist Church Conferences throughout the US. Our conversation, prayer, and concern was dominated by the storms and flooding that have happened recently in the southeast, predominantly in North Carolina and Georgia. So many lives have been disrupted into chaos. I had to remind the group that we are still recovering from epic floods and some tornado damage in the Upper Midwest Conference as well. It truly seems overwhelming when you consider all the people, homes, and businesses that have been negatively affected. How do we respond to all these great needs in the name of Jesus?

We as individual churches must be ok with giving ourselves permission to make choices. Perhaps we cannot do all things, but what if we focused our energy on doing one thing well? I am reminded of the scripture in Matthew chapter 9. Jesus was approached by a synagogue leader whose daughter was very ill, perhaps dying. Jesus agrees to go at once and heal this grieving father'-s little girl. But there were others in the crowd who had sought out Jesus to receive the blessings of their own healings for their illnesses.

Matthew 9:20-21

20 Just then a woman who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years came up behind him and touched the edge of his cloak. 21 She said to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be healed."

Jesus, told of this little girl's illness leading to her death, made her His priority and was prepared to walk past this other long-suffering woman in haste to reach her bedside. Yet in an act of great faith, the long-suffering woman reached out-if only I could touch the hem of his cloak, it would be enough to heal me... Jesus turned to this woman and saw her-truly looked at one who would have been considered unclean due to her affliction.

Matthew 9:22b

"Take heart, daughter," he said, "your faith has healed you." And the woman was healed at that moment.

In prayer we may not understand why Jesus does not just reach out and stop the winds, water, and fires that are hurting this world... In faith we know He has stopped a storm before. But with prayer and purpose we can respond in faith like the suffering woman and reach out to touch His cloak. We can participate in the healing of these lives affected by chaos in this generation. Administratively the Conference does not have funds set aside for "rainy days." But as a conference of Methodists, we have a heart and history of response to those in need of Jesus' healing presence in their lives.

So, I ask all our churches to choose and focus on where the Holy Spirit is leading them with their response.


